Update: Part 1 – As of 12 Oct 17 Fort Lee has the ability to enroll Family Members in AtHoc under the sponsors account. Information has been shared with organizations on how to enroll a Family Member; instructions will also be provided as a handout during this session as a takeaway.

Part 2 – The commercial (non-DA) AtHoc app is no longer on the approved downloads for GOV devices; however, there is a Blackberry version on the Google and Apple store sites.

Way ahead: Recommend registration of Family Members utilizing the sponsor update (self-registration) field to bridge the emergency communication gap as the way forward for units, agencies, organizations that are authorized to use the HQDA enterprise solution for emergency messaging via text, telephone and/or email.

Challenges

- Delay in detection and reporting
- Aging infrastructure
- Potential health effects and symptoms associated with mold exposure
- No federal regulations or standards for airborne mold contaminants
- Remediation efforts delayed by outsourcing
- No ownership of IAQ program

Steps to Prevent Mold



The Key to Mold Control is Moisture Control

- Repair leaks
- Prevent condensation – add insulation, increase surface temperature, increase air circulation
- Vent moisture producing equipment & appliances outside
- Maintain interior RH < 60% (ideal 30-50%)
- Ensure AC systems drain
- Dry and clean wet areas within 48 hrs
- Ensure water drains away from building
- Keep windows closed (HVAC are not designed to handle additional moisture introduced from outside)

- Regularly inspect building areas for evidence of dampness/moisture
- Take prompt steps to identify and correct the causes of any dampness problems
- Conduct regularly scheduled HVAC inspections/maintenance and promptly correct any problems
- Prevent high indoor humidity through design and operation of HVAC systems
- Encourage building occupants to report issues immediately to DPW, Safety, and/or Industrial Hygiene
- Clean and repair or replace any building materials that are moisture damaged or show evidence of visible mold growth [Follow remediation guidelines per USACHPPM TG 277 (*Army Facilities Management Information Document on Mold Remediation Issues*, February 2002) and consult with Industrial Hygiene] (NOTE: The removal and cleaning of mold contaminated materials must be handled with proper precautions...consult with Industrial Hygiene. Isolated areas, < 10 SF, may be addressed by occupants.)

Special Topic

- Who:** All personnel at Fort Lee
- What:** Construction sites off-limits to non-construction personnel
- Where:** Multiple sites around post
- When:** Daily at construction sites
- Why:** Construction sites are inherently dangerous and require continuous monitoring and accountability of personnel within the site by the contractor. Because the contractor is legally liable for all activities and the life, health and safety of all personnel entering the site, construction sites are off-limits to all non-construction personnel.

Construction site boundaries are clearly marked with fencing, cones, and/or signage however, due to on-going operations and/or access requirements, often cannot be fully “locked down”. In these instances, while the site may look open, it is still restricted to construction personnel only. Do not step over/around any physical barriers but instead utilize alternate paths of travel when provided. No shortcut is worth possible injury or death.
