

Due-Out: Part 1 - Can Family Members (FM) be enrolled in AtHoc

Part 2 – Are we meeting the intent/need of the population for emergency notifications

Update: Part 1 – As of 12 Oct 17 Fort Lee has the ability to enroll FM in AtHoc under the sponsors account. Information has been shared with organizations on how to enroll a FM; instructions will also be provided as a handout during this session as a takeaway.

Part 2 – Conducted test of AtHoc (15 Nov) to determine how many FM have an active registration and how many received the test notification. (NOTE: FM are registered via their authorized sponsor to access a GOV computer system).

Registered Family: 188 **FM Acknowledgement of test message:** 20 or (11% of registered FM)

- Way ahead: Recommend registration of FM utilizing the sponsor update (self-registration) field to bridge the emergency communication gap as the way forward for units, agencies, organizations that are authorized to use the HQDA enterprise solution for emergency messaging via text, telephone and/or email.

Due-Out: Speeding in housing

- **Update:** The PMO met with members of the housing community to discuss their concerns about speeding in the neighborhoods.
- Way Ahead: The PMO is conducting speed surveys in the housing areas. Upon completion of the surveys they will develop a traffic enforcement plan which will consist of community education and traffic enforcement. PMO will follow up with the Families and provide an update on the progress.

Due-Out: Feasibility of additional crosswalks in housing

- **Update:** The Property Management Team does not have the authority to place traffic control devices within the RCI footprint without the Traffic Review Board's (TRB) approval. The TRB is the approving authority for additional crosswalks on the installation. Approval must be based on guidance and criteria received from the Surface Deployment and Distribution Command Transportation Agency. Review of guidance and criteria including pedestrian crossing volume, two way traffic volume, distance from controlled intersection, and gap in sidewalk shows this request cannot be approved.
- Way Ahead: Pedestrian safety standards will be republished to all Fort Lee Family Housing residents. Drivers are encouraged to remain alert when traveling the neighborhood roadways, stay below the posted speed limits, direct parents to accompany their students to the bus stops, and wear reflective clothing during low-light conditions.

Due-Out: Private Organizations (Do we have a limit on Troops Girl/Boy Scouts); What is the rules for non-affiliated Troops to Fort Lee (but with authorized DoD/DA Dependents) within the Troops being authorized to solicit donations/sale on the installation

Update: Girl Scout Troops that are approved, by the Garrison Commander, to operate as a Fort Lee Private Organization are governed by AR 210-22. Per Mrs. Kathleen Sestak, Girl Scouts of the Commonwealth of VA council's Senior Director of Membership Recruitment & Placement, Troop membership is determined by the Girls Scouts of the United States of America standards. The total membership for a Troop is dependent on several factors but paramount is safety ratio of girls to adults.

All Girl Scout money-earning activities are governed by AR 600-29. Hereto, per AR 210-7 and local policies, Troops other than approved Fort Lee Private Organizations, are not authorized to solicit or sell on Fort Lee.

Girl Scout Troops requiring to come on Post as a Private Organization must get SJA review and authorization by the Garrison Commander.

Way ahead: The FMWR Directorate provides oversight of Private Organizations.

Due-Out: What are the Commercial Solicitation rules for Soliciting on Fort Lee?

Update: Requirements for Commercial Solicitation include:

1) The person or organization must obtain written permission from the Garrison Commander.

2) The person or organization is licensed under applicable Federal, State, or municipal laws and has complied with post regulations.

3) Soliciting in Government Family Housing will be in accordance with AR210-50, installation and RCI policies.

4) Sale of life insurance products and securities are in accordance with AR210-7.
5) Approved on-post financial institutions and non-Government non commercial organizations may only provide education programs in accordance with AR210-7.
6) Commercial sponsorship of MWR programs or events may not be used as a means to obtain personal contact information for solicitation purposes without permission.

7) Must pass the background checks and get an access pass on Fort Lee.

- **Way Ahead:** The rules above are not all-inclusive and therefore all requests must be reviewed by the SJA prior to approval by the Garrison Commander.

Fire Prevention and Safety Tips

1. Decorations and Christmas trees - ensure all lighting is UL approved and used in the appropriate place (i.e., indoor lights should not be used outdoors), decorations should not be hung near a heat source, and green/live Christmas trees should be watered and checked regularly to ensure they don't dry out and burn.

2. Space heaters - two fire in offices already this year. All space heaters need to be approved by supervisors and be UL approved with tip switches (to ensure they automatically turn off if tipped over). Extension cords and power strips are not to be used to power space heaters. Space heaters are required to be plugged directly into wall sockets.


3. Cooking - just like barbequing in the summer, keep those deep fryers away from structures and do not overfill with oil. Spill over when placing the turkey in the hot oil will cause a fire (additionally, turkeys should be fully thawed prior to placing in the hot oil).

To ensure the proper level of oil - first put the turkey in the empty fryer and fill with water to the proper level, then remove the turkey and the water level will show how much oil to use. Empty the water and dry the fryer before adding oil.
