

FY18 Local Prioritized Issues

1. Issue #2718 No On-Post Urgent Care

- Place in action an on post urgent care facility to be administered and overseen by Kenner Army Health Clinic.
- Operating hours should include 24 hours a day / seven days a week to include holidays for children and adults for non-life or -limb threatening illnesses or injuries.

FY18 Local Prioritized Issues

2. Issue #4418 Fort Lee Needs School On Post

- Place an elementary school (K-5) on Fort Lee, built with DoDEA or other funding identified by Fort Lee to be administrated by Prince George County Public Schools.
- In the interim, Service Members stationed at Fort Lee, but living off the installation, should be able to obtain a school choice waiver to attend a Prince George County Public School.



FY18 Local Prioritized Issues

3. Issue #4218 Handicap Accessible Playgrounds

- Remove the mulch from all Fort Lee
 neighborhood playgrounds and put in a flooring
 that allows wheel chairs to ride smoothly and
 children who crawl to gain better access and not
 be limited.
- Include at least one piece of equipment in neighborhood playgrounds that has a ramp for easy access and a swing that is usable for children that are differently-abled.

Enrollment in Public Schools – SB 775

The child shall be allowed to enroll in the school division of the child's intended residence if documentation is provided, military orders from the service member parent or an official letter from the service member's command indicating such relocation. Document should indicate a permanent address within the school division and shall be provided to the school division within 120 days of the child's enrollment or tuition may be charged, including tuition for the days since the child's enrollment in school. The assignment of the school shall be determined by the local school division.

Enrollment for Students Residing on a Military Installation – HB 1085

Any local school board of a school division in which a military installation or other military housing is located shall establish and implement policies to provide for the enrollment to any school of any student residing on a military installation or in military housing within the school division upon request of the parent if space in the school is available. In developing such policies, a local school board may include any conditions listed in Subsection A of 22.1-7.1 or any other condition deemed appropriate by the local school board.

Guide to Supervise Your Child

Guidance from the FORT LEE (FL) REGULATION 608-1, April 2017

* Children defined as having special needs as defined in AR 608-75, their disability is the primary factor in determining the need for supervision. Age is a secondary factor.

HOME ALONE?

Birth to 5th Grade - NEVER (Direct supervision at all times)
Grades 6 - (must be at least 11 yrs old) 2 consecutive hours (monitored)

Grades 7& 8 - Up to 4 consecutive hours (self-care)
Grades 9 & 10 - Up to 6 consecutive hours (self-care)

Grades 11 & 12 - Up to 10 consecutive hours (Ages 16 & 17) (self-care)

***Children age 16 - 17 may be under self-care overnight in their assigned quarters Overnight defined - 2200-0600 Sunday-Thursday & 2300-0500 Friday and Saturday

BABYSITTING?

Birth - 12 years old - NEVER

Age 13 and over (child's maturity level determined to be adequate by parent) For additional guidance, Please refer to Appendix A of FL Regulation 608-1

UNATTENDED OUTSIDE?

A finding of neglect is usually appropriate in any situation where a child, under the age of 11, is left unattended (or left attended by a child under the age of 13) for an inappropriate amount of time.

*Direct supervision at all times: Adult supervision on a regular basis during out of school hours during parental duty day.

•Monitored: An adult is aware of child's location and activities during out of school hours. An emergency contact is available at all times.

·Self-Care: Parents assess child's ability to be in self-care.
