SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER CLINICAL CARE

In January 2018, the Kenner Behavioral Health, Substance Use Disorder Clinical Care (SUDCC) Division began accepting low-risk alcohol users on a

Voluntary basis (without Command involvement) for assessment and treatment if the Service Member noticed any of the following:

- Concern that their alcohol use has increased over the past several weeks to months
- Someone has expressed concern about their use
- They are drinking to fit in
- They are interested in learning better ways to cope with down/off time other than drinking

SUDCC Mission

Provides substance use disorder clinical care, including 4 main components: assessment, treatment, rehabilitation, and aftercare for Service Members and other beneficiaries within an integrated medical and behavioral health model to enhance health and readiness



16-3. Walking/Jogging with Headphones

The use of portable headphones, earphones/earbuds or other listening and entertainment devices while walking, jogging, skating, bicycling or skateboarding on installation sidewalks, roadways or areas adjacent to roadways is prohibited. Headphones and earphones/earbuds may be worn when using any of the Fort Lee running tracks. However, single earpiece devices are permitted for use on sidewalks.

3-1. Speed Limits

Speed limit on Fort Lee is 25 MPH unless otherwise posted. 10 MPH when approaching or passing a formation and 15 MPH in housing areas.

Crosswalk Safety: VA law applies on Fort Lee

Virginia law requires that pedestrians use crosswalks if they are available. Motor vehicles must yield to pedestrians in a crosswalk, whether the crosswalk is marked or not. Pedestrians are also responsible for paying attention at cross walks.
