## **Golf Pro Tip**

Let's talk about fairway metal shots. Fairway metals are designed to "sweep" the ball off of the grass, which helps you generate more distance, due to the longer shafts and additional loft. I don't feel you necessarily have to create a new swing for the fairway metals but you may want to flatten your swing just a bit to help you "sweep" the ball off of the grass. Your ball position should be just a bit more forward in your stance versus having the ball in the middle of your stance as you might have for most of your iron shots. Experiment with this. If you make better contact with the ball in the middle of your stance, that's okay too, but I bet you'll have increased your chances of a solid golf shot with the ball just a bit forward in your stance. When you get to the top of your backswing, your back should be facing towards the target. As you start your downswing, unwinding your hips, shoulders and hands, remember, stay down and through your shot. As I've stated, this is more of a sweeping shot with a bit of a shallower or flatter swing. If you do take a divot, that's okay too, as long as you stay committed through your swing and don't just stop the swing because you may have taken a divot. Having finished your shot, your body should now be facing your target and hopefully you're staring at a successful shot.
