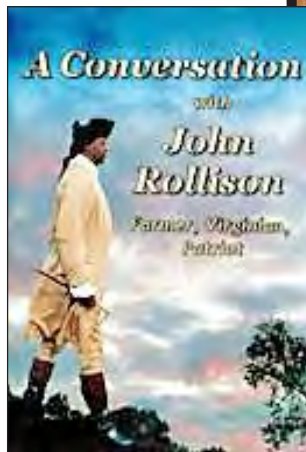

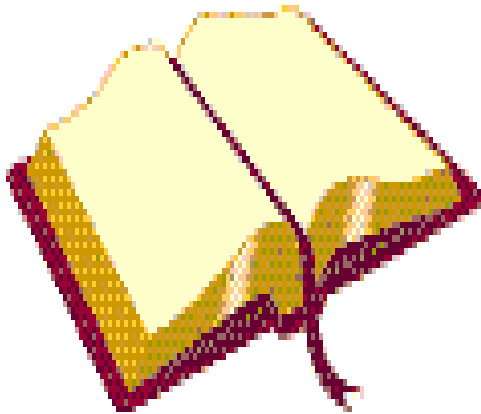

VAPING

What is Vaping?

Vaping is the inhaling of a vapor created by an electronic cigarette (e-cigarette) or other vaping device.

E-cigarettes are battery-powered smoking devices. They have cartridges filled with a liquid that usually contains nicotine, flavorings and chemicals. The liquid is heated into a vapor, which the person inhales. That's why using e-cigarettes is called "vaping."

Vapor is not just water

- E-cigarette vapor is an aerosol mist full of toxic chemicals.
- Many people think with flavored vapes that they are inhaling harmless flavored water.
- Some of the toxins found in vapes include formaldehyde, heavy metals such as nickel, tin or lead, and other chemicals known to harm health.

The use of e-cigarettes is unsafe for kids, teens and young adults

- Most e-cigarettes contain nicotine. Nicotine is highly addictive and can harm adolescent brain development, which continues into the early-to mid-20s.
- E-cigarettes can contain other harmful substances besides nicotine.
- Young people who use e-cigarettes may be more likely to smoke cigarettes in the future.

Other risks for everyone

- Scientists are still learning about the long-term health effects of e-cigarettes.
- Some of the ingredients in e-cigarette aerosol could also be harmful to the lungs in the long term. For example, some e-cigarette

flavorings may be safe to eat but not to inhale because the gut can process more substances than the lungs.

Defective e-cigarette batteries have caused some fires and explosions, a few of which have resulted in serious injuries.

Children and adults have been poisoned by swallowing, breathing, or absorbing e-cigarette liquid through their skin or eyes.

In the U.S., teenagers are more likely than adults to use e-cigarettes

In 2018, 3.6 million U.S. middle and high school students used e-cigarettes in a 30-day period.

The CDC, U.S. Food and Drug Administration, state and local health departments, and other clinical and public health partners are investigating a multistate outbreak of severe pulmonary disease associated with e-cigarette product (devices, liquids, refill pods, and/or cartridges) use. This investigation is ongoing and has not identified a cause, but all reported cases have a history of using e-cigarette products.

What is a JUUL?

Also called JUULing, it is a new e-cigarette shaped like a USB flash drive being used by students in schools.

JUUL's nicotine liquid refills are called "pods." JUUL is available in several flavors such as Cool Cucumber, Fruit Medley, Mango and Mint.



Although JUUL is currently the top-selling e-cigarette brand in the U.S., other companies sell e-cigarettes that look like USB flash drives. Examples include the MarkTen Elite, a nicotine delivery device and the PAX Era, a marijuana delivery device that looks like JUUL.

All JUUL e-cigarettes have a high level of nicotine. According to the manufacturer, a single JUUL pod contains as much nicotine as a pack of 20 regular cigarettes.

2019 Great Southeast U.S. Shake Out

17 October @ 10:17

- Background. Earthquakes can occur whenever and wherever conditions are right, throughout the year. Between 2000 and 2018 there have been 30,641 earthquakes with a magnitude of 5.0 or higher globally. Virginia has had 144 earthquakes from 2000 to 2019. **These earthquakes have ranged from magnitude 0 to the 2011 5.8 magnitude earthquake and subsequent aftershocks. This was the largest earthquake recorded east of the Rocky Mountains since 1944 and the strongest ever recorded in the central Virginia seismic zone.**

- On October 17, 2019, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, Virginia Department of Emergency Management and other South East state and local emergency management agencies will be leading the Great Southeast Shakeout Drill. **To start the October 17th drill, the Fort Lee Installation Operations Center (IOC) will send a test earthquake message through ALERTs that will trigger the drill.** The 2018 earthquake drill had over 2.2 million Virginians participate and an international total of 12.5 million people registered and participating.

- Fort Lee conducts an installation-wide earthquake drill on 171017OCT19, to improve the installation's preparedness to respond to an earthquake.

Phase I – Preparation. The Preparation phase includes all activities throughout the year that organizations and individuals conduct to maintain emergency preparedness. During this phase all tenants' review existing emergency action plans or creating plans to ensure that procedures are in place for their personnel to respond to an earthquake and that all key leaders understand these procedures. The weekly test of the installation's mass warning and notification system (MWNS) is a Preparation Phase Activity.

Phase II – Earthquake. This phase begins when the Installation Operation Center (IOC) notifies the installation that the earthquake Drill has begun and that an "Exercise" earthquake has occurred. **Tenants' response procedures to the earthquake drill should include, but are not limited to taking those actions which will immediately protect you by: 1) drop to the ground, 2) take cover by getting under a sturdy desk or table, 3) hold on until the shaking stops. Do not get in a doorway or run outside due to falling debris and glass.**

Phase III – Personnel Accountability. Garrison directorates and tenant organizations will conduct an internal post-disaster personnel accountability drill to ensure all personnel are accounted for after the disaster.

Phase IV – Damage Assessment / Recovery and Review. Garrison directorates and tenant organizations will conduct an internal facility damage assessment and after action review upon completion of this drill. The results of this drill should be used to enhance those internal facility plans for future planning and response actions for an earthquake.

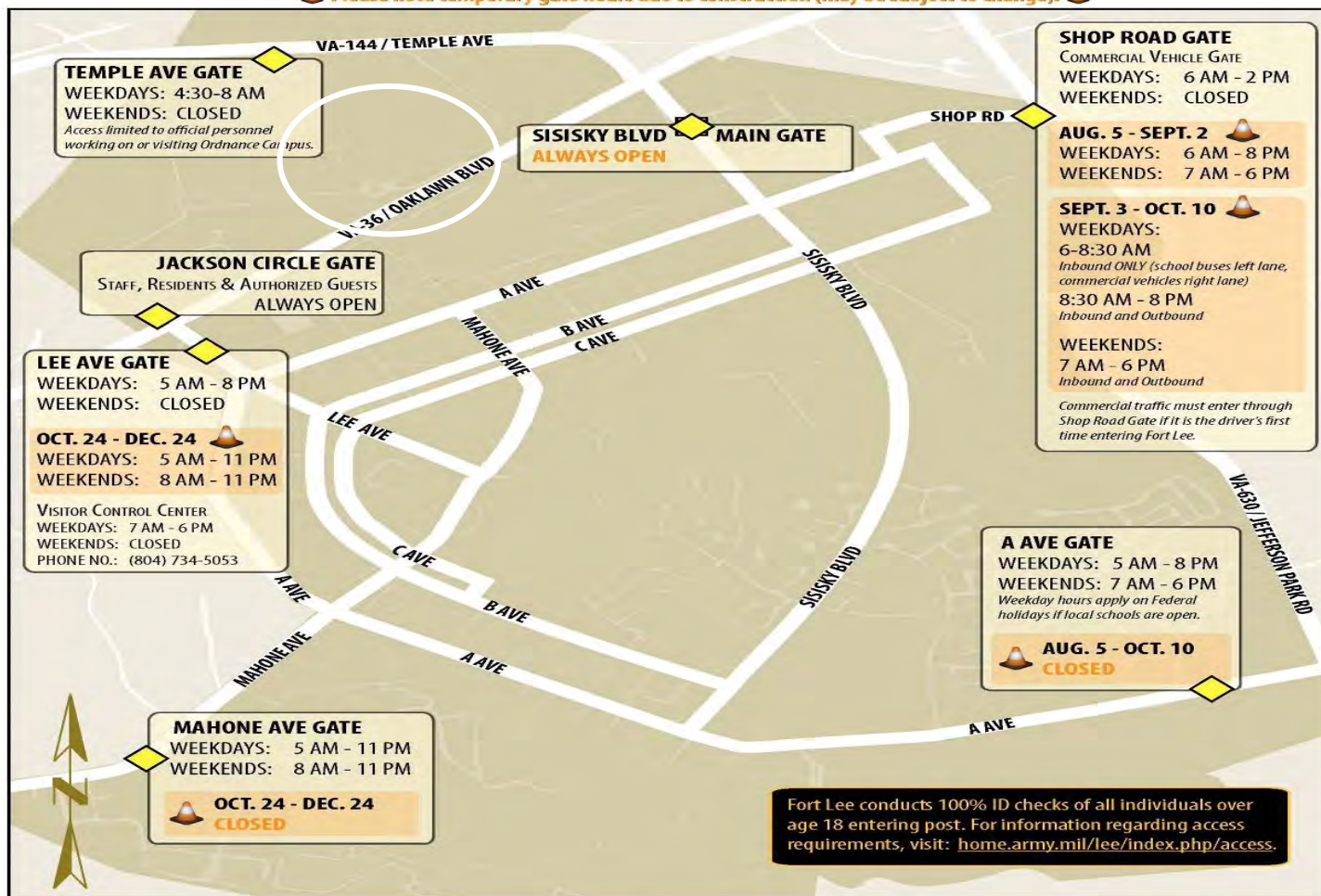
